The Parish Council is involved in all local matters such as planning, highways, and community facilities. All our candidates are already Oxted Parish Councillors and are standing for re-election. OLRG is aiming to continue with a residents-run Parish Council that is independent and non-political and whose only allegiance is to the community.

Our candidates are:



Peter DAMESICK: Peter was elected to the Parish Council in May 2019 and is standing for re-election. On the Parish Council he has served as chair and member of the planning committee and chair of the CIL working group which is responsible for assessing and proposing projects to be supported with the Council's Community Infrastructure Levy funds. He is keen to continue to work actively on the Parish Council for the benefit of the local community.

Peter GILES: Peter is standing for re-election having been a Parish Councillor since May 2019. He has served as chair of the Parish Council, chair of the burial ground committee and chair of the finance working group. He is one of the founder members of OLRG and has been involved with many local issues since the group was set up 15 years ago. He is keen to continue working for the local community, not least to deliver the CCTV project that he and Reg Hull are leading.





Reg HULL: Reg is standing for re-election after four years because he believes that party politics should not be the main driver at a local level and that Councillors should be listening to the local community, working together and doing their best to deliver improvements that benefit us all.

Jean INKER: Jean became a

Parish Councillor last July and would be delighted to have the chance to continue in the role. She is keen to focus her energy and efforts into the local community. She has worked for 40 years as an HR (Human Resources) professional and currently does contract work in the education sector.

a Parish Councillor last July and is standing for re-election. He has been a member of the planning committee and would like to continue to work for residents' interests

and to make a difference on issues that are important to them and to the local area.

Denize WALLACE: Denize is the current vice chair of the Parish Council and will again be standing for election to continue working for the community's interest. As well as



being chair of the burial ground committee, Denize has been very active with various support groups, sending goods to Ukraine and is currently co-ordinating deliveries of clothes, blankets and medical equipment to Turkey for the earthquake appeal.

Some of the work that Oxted Parish Council (OPC) is doing:

- OPC has reserved funds towards the installation of CCTV.
- OPC has funding from the Community Infrastructure Levy (raised from new development) to award to qualifying projects. So far it has paid for a vehicle activated speed sign at the bottom of Wolfs Hill, awarded a sum of money towards the new Master Park Pavilion, contributed towards the refurbishment of the Barn Theatre, awarded funds which were matched by Tandridge District Council for the renewal of the courts at the Hurst Green Tennis Club, paid for various improvements and for books at Hurst Green School.
- OPC owns and runs the burial ground situated behind St Mary's Church. The burial ground committee meets every two months.
- The planning committee meets every three weeks to consider planning applications throughout its area and makes recommendations to Tandridge District Council.
- OPC has representatives on various outside bodies East Surrey Transport, Master Park, Citizens Advice, United Churches, Surrey Rail Partnership.
- OPC allocates Grant Aid every year to a variety of small organisations and charities.
- OPC meets once a month where it discusses current issues and receives an update from Tandridge District and Surrey County Councillors.
