The Parish Council is involved in all local matters such as planning, highways, and community facilities. Two of our candidates are already Oxted Parish Councillors and are standing for re-election. OLRG is aiming to continue with a residents-run Parish Council that is independent and non-political and whose only allegiance is to the community. Our candidates are:



Alan FEESEY: Formerly Chair of the Tandridge District Council Resident Forum, Alan was elected to Oxted Parish Council in May 2019. He is currently the Parish Council's representative on the East Surrey Transport Committee and the Hurst Green Community Centre. He sits on the Grant Aid Committee within the council. He is working with District and fellow Parish Councillors to create a "Courtyard" outside space in front of Pollard Oak Road shops. He is passionate about helping local residents and making Hurst Green a great place to live.

John HOPE: John is standing for the first time and has lived in Oxted since 1992. He was deputy chair of Governors at Holland Junior School in the early 2000s and has been an active participant since 2016 in OLRG's successful efforts to secure community representation on Tandridge District Council. John's prior career with an international energy company involved 17 years of overseas service in both Europe and North America





Gerard QUINN: Gerard is standing for the first time and has lived in Oxted / Hurst Green since 2011 with his wife and son. He has 40 years of commercial experience developed through a number of roles in Marine Insurance world-wide. "I believe strongly that the issues which affect our community are best dealt with by local councillors who do not hold a political bias in order to maximise the benefit to the community. The Parish Council has an important and significant role to play in this strategy and I would like to ensure that the voice of residents is heard and acted upon in the best interests of our local community".

Deb SHINER: Deb was elected to the Parish Council in May 2019 and is the current Chair. She sits



on the Planning, Finance and Staffing committees and also on the committee responsible for assessing projects to be supported with the council's Community Infrastructure Levy funds. She is an active member of the Pollards Oak Road "Courtyard" working party and if re-elected will be working with Surrey County Council to improve the street lighting in the district. Together with Alan Feesey, Deb puts out Remembrance Day poppies throughout the Hurst Green area each year.

Some of the work that Oxted Parish Council (OPC) is doing:

- OPC has reserved funds towards the installation of CCTV.
- OPC has funding from the Community Infrastructure Levy (raised from new development) to award to qualifying projects. So far it has paid for a vehicle activated speed sign at the bottom of Wolfs Hill, awarded a sum of money towards the new Master Park Pavilion, contributed towards the refurbishment of the Barn Theatre, awarded funds which were matched by Tandridge District Council for the renewal of the courts at the Hurst Green Tennis Club, paid for various improvements and for books at Hurst Green School.
- OPC owns and runs the burial ground situated behind St Mary's Church. The burial ground committee meets every two months.
- The planning committee meets every three weeks to consider planning applications throughout its area and makes recommendations to Tandridge District Council.
- OPC has representatives on various outside bodies East Surrey Transport, Master Park, Citizens Advice, United Churches, Surrey Rail Partnership.
- OPC allocates Grant Aid every year to a variety of small organisations and charities.
- OPC meets once a month where it discusses current issues and receives an update from Tandridge District and Surrey County Councillors.
